Arrangements for GCSE & A-level Awards

The Government have now confirmed the process for assessing the outcome of GCSE and Alevels. The full details of this can be found here: https://www.gov.uk/government/news/how-gcses-as-a-levels-will-be-awarded-in-summer-2020

We will be working to implement this over the coming weeks (Mr Whitehouse is leading on this and has already communicated our plans to Heads of Department) to ensure that every student in Years 11 and 13 will receive fair grades.

One of the key messages for students is that there is no requirement for them to undertake any additional work or exams (including completing unfinished coursework). Our teachers and Heads of Department are experienced professionals and I am confident they will apply this system fairly. I would also like to draw your attention to the provision for confidentiality – as stated, we will not be able to share with parents or students any information about our grading or ranking of students. I know that this will be frustrating for you, but we must apply all of these requirements to the letter.

Mr Constable will be writing separately to all of the students who have applied for a place in our Sixth Form with an update on how we will be proceeding. The key message is don't panic! We will be working with you all to support you through this process.
