Headteacher's Weekly Update

First Extended Parents Evening – Thursday 23rd November – Early School Closure

I wrote at the beginning of the year to inform you all that we were going to try arranging parents' evenings differently this year as a common complaint from parents was that there were not enough appointments. Therefore, Year 7-11 parents' evenings will begin from 1pm. By doing this we create lots of additional appointments, however, we also recognise that it eats into the school day.
