## **Headteacher's Weekly Update**

The Easter holiday already feels a distant memory as we have hit the ground running at the start of a critical half-term, particularly for Years 11 and 13 as they enter the summer exam season. There is lots going on at the moment so it is a larger than usual letter this week.

#### **NEU Strike Action**

The NEU has now announced two further dates for national strike action:

- Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April
- Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May

The Year 11 Creative Media Production exam scheduled for Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> will go ahead as planned – all students entered must attend as this is an external exam.

We will be able to offer the following provision for both strike days:

On Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> & Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> students in only Years 11, 12 and 13 must attend school with Years 7-10 remaining at home.

**Years 11, 12 & 13:** students have their lessons as usual if their teacher is in school. If any of their teachers are striking then Year 11 students will be supervised to complete independent revision while Year 13 students will have an independent study period. Students must come to school with revision materials so that they are able to work independently if required.

The NEU has issued guidelines aimed at reducing the impact of these strikes on the exam preparation for students in Years 11 and 13. I have therefore put an offer to NEU members at the school that could allow them to strike but still be able to deliver lessons for students in Years 11 and 13. While I cannot know in advance how many staff will be available to deliver lessons to Year 11 and 13 on the strike days (as they are not required to inform me), I hope that these arrangements will ensure that students receive the best possible preparation for their forthcoming exams.

**Year 10:** the students will remain at home. They will be offered live lessons via Teams if their teacher is not striking. As staff are not required to tell us if they are striking, students will need to log on at the start of each lesson. If they do not have a lesson, students should complete any outstanding homework or read.

**Years 7, 8 & 9:** the students will remain at home. In a change from previous strikes, they will be set work via Satchel One if their teacher is not striking. We have made this change in response to feedback about the disruption students faced by not knowing if teachers would be delivering lessons or not. This way, students will be able to see in advance what work they need to complete











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during the strike day. If a teacher is striking then we cannot set work for their classes and so students should complete any outstanding homework or read during those lessons.

For all pupils in receipt of free school meals, they will be able to collect a food parcel (after school on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> and Friday 28<sup>th</sup>) from the canteen for the strike days that follow.

I appreciate that strike action causes disruption to families and I really do appreciate your support. I know my colleagues and I know that they do not take this action lightly and that they do so because they believe in their cause.

It appears that all major teaching unions will be re-balloting on further strike action so we may continue to face disruption. I will keep you updated.

# May Half-Term Revision Sessions for Years 11 and 13

I am so pleased to see that so many Year 11 and 13 students attended the Easter revision sessions during the holiday. I am confident that these sessions will have helped the students prepare for their upcoming exams and I am grateful to all the staff who gave up their time to support the sessions.

I want to give you advanced notice that further revision sessions will be offered during May half-term (Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> May – Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> June, not Monday 29<sup>th</sup> as this is a bank holiday), so please make plans to be able to support your child to attend.

### **Staff Recruitment**

We are busily recruiting the extra teachers needed for September. In the meantime, we are seeking a new clerk to the Local Advisory Board. We won't be making any significant changes so there will be no need for you to purchase new or additional items. It does give us the opportunity to consider whether having four ties (one for each house) is the best option or if the time is right to move to return a single tie design. We are therefore consulting all stakeholders on the following options:
