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# What have we done in form time?

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# What else are we doing to help?

- Tonight's options evening for parents and pupils will hopefully aid the making of this decision.
- Tomorrow in extended tutor time there will be an 'initial poll' where your child will be sent an email with a link to a Microsoft form. They will need to click on this and select the four options that they think they are most likely to choose.
  - Please note that this is NOT their final decision but will help us see if there are any pupils who need extra help in making the decision.



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# What else are we doing to help?

- In tutor time after half term, subjects that Year 9 are yet to study will be providing an overview of what the course entails.
- These include Business, Marketing and Enterprise, Hospitality and Catering, 3D Design, Media Studies, Creative Media Production and Classical Civilisation, Health and Social Care.
- Also in lessons after half term, current subjects will be putting some lesson time towards showcasing their subject and what this entails at GCSE.
- With the two initiatives above running side by side we are hoping that pupils will have a broad understanding of all the subjects from which they can choose.

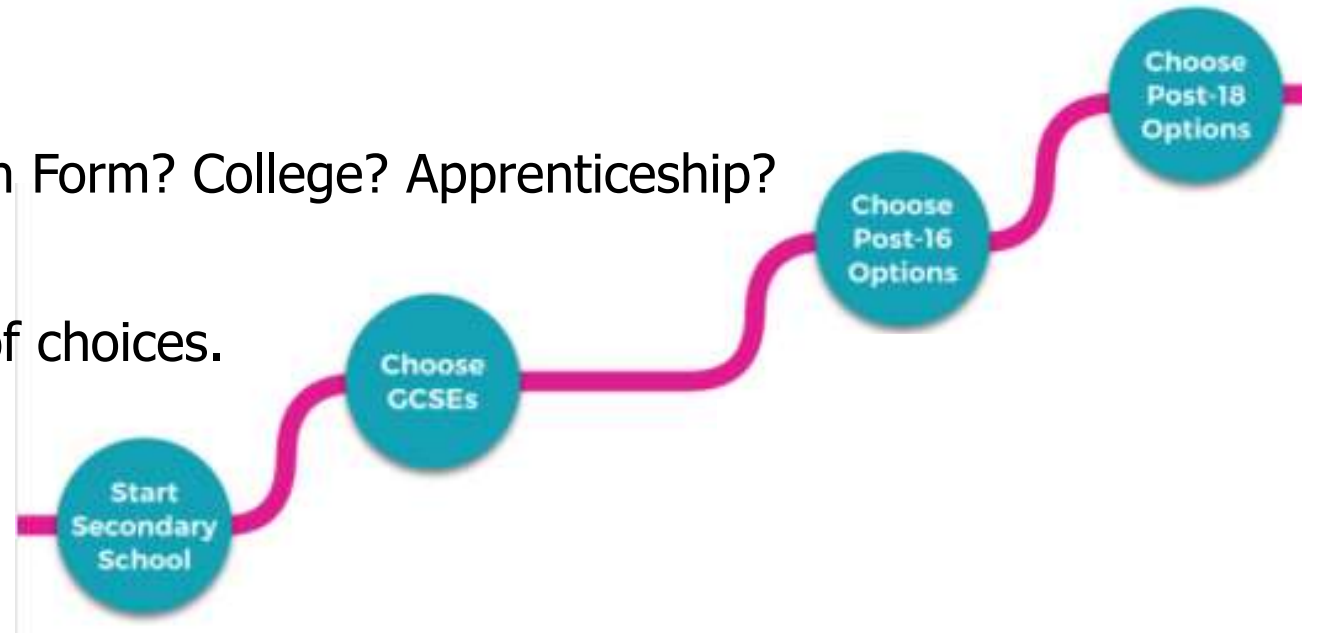

**Students need to pick 4 options subjects**

**To do this, they need to make an informed decision!**

**Making an Informed Decision requires them:**

To read the information available to them regarding the option subjects (in booklet and on the website)

To speak to their teachers regarding possible choices and their suitability

To speak to their teachers regarding the transferable skills they can gain / jobs it helps lead into

To speak to other pupils who study the subject

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# Qualifications for Key Stage 4

## **GCSE**

- Assessed through examinations at the end of the course.
- Graded 9 to 1 for all subjects.

## **Vocational (BTEC, Cambridge National, Vocational award)**

- Continuous assessment with some external assessment.
- Graded Distinction\*, Distinction, Merit, Pass.

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# The Ebacc (English Baccalaureate)

The EBacc is not a qualification in its own right – it's a combination of GCSE subjects, including a language, that offer an important range of knowledge and skills to young people.

The DfE say that:

*"EBACC FUTURE PROOFS YOUR CHILD'S PROSPECTS"*

While your child may not have decided on their future career path yet, choosing the EBacc at GCSE gives them access to a full range of employment options when they leave secondary school and the broad knowledge that employers are looking for.

If they are thinking of going to university, the EBacc is also recommended by Britain's most prestigious universities.



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# Combinations of subjects

Do I have freedom of choice?

- Yes.

But....there are some rules.

1) Every student must choose at least one from the 'yellow' list – Computer Science, Geography, History and French. Having at least one of these keeps many more options available in the future.

2) There are certain subjects which are just 'too similar' and so cannot be picked together. These are:

- i) GCSE Media and Creative Media Production
- ii) GCSE Fine Art and GCSE 3D design
- iii) GCSE Business and CNAT Marketing and Enterprise
