

A Level Exam Results 2020

Just like our GCSE cohort, the Sixth form 'class of 2020' did not get the opportunity to actually sit their finals. Covid restrictions meant that they were unable to take the exams which would have been the culmination of two years very hard work. A-levels are not about the exams, they are about the learning and progress made over the duration of the course. We are immensely proud of the way these students went about their studies and conducted themselves as their courses ended in the most unprecedented of circumstances. We are delighted that the students were awarded the grades that their hard work and effort deserved.

One quarter of our students achieved A* and A grade passes, and over 80% secured A*-C grades. This represents an improvement on last year and keeps our Sixth Form performance in-line with all of the high performing local and National Sixth Forms.

Academic achievement is strong across the breadth of the curriculum. The school's strong focus on academic excellence has paid dividends across a broad range of A level subjects. A significant proportion of students achieved the highest grades of A*/A in a wide range of subjects, including: English Literature, Maths, Further Maths, Media and Religious Studies.
