## **RE: Weekly Update**

### Covid-19

Please continue to engage with home testing and remember to report your results to the NHS <u>here</u> (please inform us of a positive result).

Remember any student with symptoms (new persistent cough, high temperature, loss of sense of smell or taste) must self-isolate (along with all members of the household) until a negative PCR test is secured.

There are emerging reports that the delta variant can present with different symptoms. These include:

- Headache
- Sore throat
- Runny nose

At present the official guidance regarding symptoms remains unchanged, so I am drawing this to your attention only so that you are aware and can be vigilant.

## GCSE Pod

Students in Years 9, 10 and 11 now have access to the e-learning platform <u>GCSEPod</u>. Students will be able to log in, using their school email accounts and will have access to a wide range of learning and revision resources across all their subject areas.

- Year 9 are encouraged to become familiar with the site and work through the transition material available as they move into their GCSE courses.
- Year 10 should utilise this resource as part of their revision schedule for their upcoming assessments.
- Year 11 also have access to transition material from GCSE to post-16 study which they may find useful to complement the summer preparation work they have already been assigned.
