Vaccinations

Following advice from the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation, children aged 12 to 15 are now being offered a second dose of the vaccine at a minimum of 12 weeks from the first dose. The School Age Immunisation Service will visit the school on Monday 31st January to offer the following:

- 1st doses of Covid-19 vaccine to any young person that has never received a vaccine.
- 2nd doses of Covid-19 vaccine to any young person that received a first dose at least 12 weeks prior to 31st January.
- For young people considered extremely clinically vulnerable (you will have received a CEV letter) a 3rd dose of the Covid-19 vaccine (8 weeks after the 2nd dose).

We will be in touch with more details.

Parents of children aged 12 and over can book vaccinations using the <u>NHS booking system</u>.
