This could be a scenario question which you include Ao1 (concepts, key terms, theories) and then apply Ao2 (link them to the scenario) and then evaluate (Ao3)











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	• RM: you will need to revise all topics for RM up to date. The RM section may have a mixture of 1,2,4,6,8,10 & 12-mark questions. Questions quite often relate to a scenario and answers must be applied in context of the scenario using RM knowledge, key terms and being able to define the instructions from the command words used in the question.
How should I revise?	 Use your PLC's to structure your revision and use it to check you have completed notes for all of the sub-topics for each topic. Check your booklets are fully completed and contain the Ao1 & Ao3 content as required by the specification. Please see me ASAP if any areas are missing. Make use of your assessment book, past questions and course booklets to go over your improvements, re-cap how to structure answers for different types of question, revise the content and re-visit style of writing, key vocabulary and use of key terms.
